

Help shape B.C.'s Accessibility Standards Share your perspectives on Accessibility Standards Public Consultation from May 31 to July 31, 2024

BCDC members and Disability Summit participants, please see this important information about the Accessible British Columbia Act (ABCA) engagement process. The ABCA will apply to any "group of people, with a particular purpose. It can be a government, business, society or charity." (Accessibility Service Delivery Standard, p. 5).

<u>The draft standards under the Act are NOT STRONG ENOUGH</u>, so it is vital for as many individuals and organizations to submit feedback as possible before the public engagement deadline of July 31. For example, the Service Delivery Standards, which apply to "government, business, society, and charity organizations" (p. 5), require organizations to remove accessibility barriers only if this costs "very little or no money." Plus, the current plan is to consider penalties for failure to comply with the standards later on, but these should be part of the Act from the outset. Basically, as it now stands, the ABCA says that organizations should accommodate disabled people as long as it doesn't cost them anything but there is no penalty for not doing so. HUH?

What Can You Do?
